

The TK Foundation 2013 Grant Summary

We at the TK Foundation are pleased to report upon a very successful year in grantmaking in 2013, in support of nonprofit programs and advancing the futures of disadvantaged youth and the maritime sector, the TK Foundation granted over \$11 Million. Grant funding supported \$5.68 Million in Youth Development, \$4.775 Million in Maritime, over \$400,000 in Scholarships, Maritime Fellowships and Maritime Conferences and \$190,000 in Disaster Relief following the November 2013 typhoon in the central islands of the Philippines.

Youth Development Grants

Our Youth Development focus area provides disadvantaged youth with opportunities to achieve self-sufficiency and maximize their capabilities.

The TK Foundation's goals for impacting the futures of Disadvantaged Youth are:

1. To improve educational achievement of disadvantaged youth
2. To prepare disadvantaged youth for succeeding in the workforce

Coady International Institute

\$100,000

The Coady International Institute is committed to reducing poverty and transforming societies by strengthening local economies, by building resilient communities, and by promoting accountable democracies. The Institute equips community leaders and their organizations with the knowledge and practical tools needed to bring about the change they want for themselves. TK Foundation funding supported the Haiti Youth Development Program which integrates Haitian youth leaders and youth-focused organizations, through education, trainings, research activities and awareness raising events.

Hispanic Unity of Florida

\$456,531

Unity 4 Teens (U4T) is a year-round after-school and summer youth development program providing education and enrichment activities to help disadvantaged youth, ages 15-19, attain academic and social success, reduce risk behaviors and learn skills so they may grow into self-sufficient, productive adults. Funding support the U4T High School Program (salaries, benefits, supplies, activities etc.).

Pfeifer Kiwanis Camp

\$150,000

The mission of Pfeifer Kiwanis Camp (PKC) is to help youth live their lives more responsibly through participation in residential programming that provides year-round opportunities to learn academic and social skills that lead to high school graduation and successful careers. TK Foundation funding is being matched with other funds to provide a College and Career Readiness program (CAC) for at-risk teens who have participated in prior programs at PKC. Even though, they have made significant improvements, they are still considered at-risk.

Propeller Club of Manila

\$14,615

The Propeller Club of Manila is dedicated to the enhancement and well-being of the diverse interests of the maritime community on a national and international basis and actively promotes the maritime industry through networking and partnering with other similar organizations The

TK Foundation has supported a scholarship program for disadvantaged youth through the Manila Propeller Club for several years. This particular small grant is to provide TKF sponsored scholars additional food rations and needed sailing equipment to the Propeller Club.

SeaChange Sailing Trust

\$78,242.50

SeaChange Sailing Trust provides residential opportunities for young people and vulnerable adults to learn and develop in a unique environment by living and working together aboard a traditional sailing vessel. Activities on the vessel focus on life skills training with increasing responsibility for their contribution and group decisions. TK Foundation will support the fundraising activities of SeaChange (including administrative and management costs) so they may secure new, long term, sustainable funding from diverse sources.

Seahorse Institute

\$100,000

The Seahorse Institute in Nassau, Bahamas, was founded in 2010 by Dr. Michelle Major as a non-profit center to provide state of the art treatment for Bahamian children with Autism and other developmental disabilities and delays. In 2012, the facility that housed Seahorse Institute was damaged in a fire. The property and most of the educational equipment was destroyed. TK Foundation funding supported the rebuilding efforts of a new facility through a 1:1 matching grant of up to \$100,000. TK Foundation has provided \$28,850 of the \$100,000 match.

Youth Development Partnerships

The TK Foundation organized two longer-term youth development partnerships in 2013, setting the stage for increased reach of philanthropic dollars while garnering geography-specific expertise in the Youth Development sector.

Community Foundations of Canada

\$2,000,000

This grant is to fund the Youth Catalyst Program, an array of granting programs and services serving disadvantaged youth in Canada from 2013 to 2016 to be administered by Community Foundations of Canada in partnership with the TK Foundation

International Youth Foundation

\$2,100,000

The TK foundation has joined with the International Youth Foundation (IYF) to support New Employment Opportunities (NEO) for disadvantaged youth in Latin America. NEO is a multi-stakeholder, region-wide initiative, whose purpose is to increase the number of young people prepared for entry-level jobs in the Latin American and Caribbean region by scaling up best practices and promoting systems reforms which will benefit disadvantaged youth and their full participation in the world of work. Officially launched at the Summit of the Americas in April 2012, it was founded by the Multilateral Investment Fund (MIF) of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), the Bank and IYF and five global companies, CEMEX, Caterpillar, Microsoft, Walmart, Arcos Dorados (Mc Donald's).

NEO's 10-Year Goals:

- Train one million disadvantaged youth, ages 16–29, using models that incorporate best practices of job training and placement programs; ensure that at least 50% are female
- Achieve job placement rates of at least 50% for its graduates

- Promote the adoption of high-impact training models in the government programs of at least 10 countries in the region
- Mobilize 1,000 companies to offer internships and employment opportunities for youth
- Strengthen the capacity of 200 job training providers.

The NEO initiative, currently in its first 5 year phase (2012—2017), will achieve its goal of preparing ½ million youth for the labor market by recruiting dynamic leaders from the private, public and civil society sectors in each country to work together to create and sustain systemic improvements in training and employment services for disadvantaged youth.

South Africa RFP

The TK Foundation ran a Request for Proposals (RFP) in 2012 specifically for youth development agencies in South Africa. Winning agencies received their first tranche of funding in early 2013.

Childline KZN

\$200,562

Childline KZN supports abused children by providing therapy, advocating on children's rights, and offering skills development and leadership training to enhance employability. The TK Foundation has provided support for the youth vocational training program aimed at developing business and work-related skills and providing career guidance and access to the labor market.

Educo Africa

\$69,120.18

Educo Africa runs a number of programs aimed at developing the competency of vulnerable youth, building up their skills so they can enter the workforce. Funding will be used to support Sihambela Phambili, Educo Africa's program aimed at encouraging alumni of their program to advance their entrepreneurial and economic productivity and to become agents of positive change.

Hantam Community Education Trust

\$184,242.60

The Hantam Community Educational Trust offers services to local farm workers and their children to provide access to schooling, academic support, and skills training in a variety of industries. The TK Foundation's grant will be used to improve the youth's educational achievement and to prepare the youth for succeeding in the workplace, specifically in their target industries of farming, hospitality, social work and teaching.

Ikamva Youth

\$141,244

Ikamva Youth provides disadvantaged secondary school learners with the necessary skills and academic support to enable them to gain access to higher education, learnerships, and employment. TK Foundation funding will be used to support the tutoring program, computer literacy training, career guidance sessions, and mentoring program at Ikamva's three Western Cape branches.

James House Life Centre

\$65,937.99

James House is a Child and Youth Care Centre offering residential care and youth development programs for at-risk youth and their families. TK Foundation will support the Adolescent Development Program providing life skills training and guidance, the Aftercare Program to assist

the youth in developing their university and career plans, and the Sibanye Youth Club to support entrepreneurship, cultural activities, sports and community upliftment.

MES Joshuas

\$158,412

MES addresses the needs of homeless, unemployed and vulnerable individuals and communities through poverty alleviation, a youth enrichment program and skills development services. TK Foundation funding will support the Joshua Youth Development and Service Program, which focuses on developing skills to enable the youth to successfully enter employment or gain entry into tertiary education.

Port Elizabeth Mental Health

\$114,765

Port Elizabeth Mental Health is a community-driven organization serving the needs of people with intellectual and psychiatric disabilities. Funding will support the Youth Skills Development program, providing practical workplace skills and life skills training to disabled youth with the aim of enabling access to jobs, learnerships and entrepreneurships.

Salesian Institute

\$263,736

The Salesian Institute provides disadvantaged vulnerable youth and homeless children living in Cape Town and its environs with a range of educational and skills training opportunities in order to enable them to become independent. The TK Foundation has provided support for the Waves of Change programme, providing over 750 learners with the necessary training, documentation and career guidance to prepare them for job placement in the sea fishing industry.

St. John's Foundation

\$165,048.84

The St John's Academy provides afterschool lessons in mathematics, English, science and computers, as well as life skills and career guidance to youth from low-income schools, enabling the participants to achieve better academic results and to gain access to tertiary institutions, learnerships or the work force. The TK Foundation has provided support for the leadership development, academic support and career guidance components of the program.

Maritime Grants

Maritime, Maritime Conference Support and Maritime Student Scholarships--

Our Maritime Focus centers on promotion of knowledge of the oceans, for the betterment of individuals, communities and the environment. We support projects and programs that improve the health, safety and welfare of seafarers, maritime education and training, and strengthen maritime security. We also support sailing projects, environmental projects and programs that shed light on maritime history.

Maritime Related

Global Maritime Education and Training Association (GlobalMet) \$20,000

The mission of GlobalMet is to promote, develop and support in the spirit of cooperation the common interests of its members in matters concerning the development and quality of Maritime Education and Training. There is a gap of what trainers are training at maritime schools (especially in the Philippines) and what is needed by the industry hiring those schools' graduates.

TK Foundation funding would help support a pilot program course in the Philippines that offers reliable training components, assesses skills, enables nationally recognized qualifications and encourages flexible training that would suit both student graduates and industry requirements.

International Seafarers Welfare and Assistance Network **\$20,000**

This grant is to provide immediate, essential aid to any and all seafarers and families of seafarers, who are directly involved in sudden and unforeseen crises. This is a transfer of TK Foundation matching funds to be credited towards Seafarers Emergency Fund (SEF).

Maritime Piracy Humanitarian Response (MPHRP) **\$383,508**

The Maritime Piracy Humanitarian Response Programme ("MPHRP") is a pan-industry alliance of ship owners, managers, manning agents, insurers, maritime unions, professional and welfare associations working together with governmental organisations with one aim, *"to assist seafarers and their families with the humanitarian aspects of a traumatic incident caused by a piracy attack, armed robbery or being taken hostage"*

This grant is to support the activities of the MPHRP including production of training guides, support networks, a database of responders, a 24 hour helpline for seafarers and their families.

KPI Association Ltd. **\$159,444**

The KPI Association Ltd. is a non-profit organization that promotes safety and efficiency in shipping via the Shipping KPI System (Shipping Key Performance Indicators). The Shipping KPI System has developed a global shipping industry standardized tool for defining, measuring and reporting information on operational performance in order to:

- Boost performance improvements internally in companies engaged in the ship operation activities,
- Provide an efficient communication platform of ship operation performance to internal and external stakeholders.

The TK Foundation grant supports operating expenses of the KPI Association.

Mercy Ships **\$1,500,000**

The Africa Mercy hospital ship provides medical care; surgeries, training and preventative health strategies to poor communities in Africa. Since 2005, TK Foundation grants have supported its Technical Training Fund (TTF) to ensure the crew's training meets international shipping standards. On the condition of evidence of appropriate endowment fund structure of the Technical Training Fund at Mercy Ships, OCCF/TK Foundation will fund **\$200,000 per year for 5 years** to establish the Technical Training Fund Endowment. Additionally, OCCF/TK Foundation will fund **\$100,000 per year for five (5) years** to support ongoing training needs of the Technical Training Fund during the establishment of the Technical Training Fund Endowment. This is first payment of a \$100,000 commitment over five (5) years.

Royal Canadian Marine Search and Rescue **\$282,800**

Royal Canadian Marine Search and Rescue (RCM-SAR), is part of the integrated maritime search and rescue system serving all mariners on the West Coast of Canada. Search and rescue (SAR) stations are strategically located in communities with strong connections to the sea. RCM SAR crews are on call around-the-clock to respond to all marine emergencies. Crews are trained to handle a wide range of missions, including providing assistance to large commercial vessels.

TK Foundation funding will support the building efforts of a state-of-the-art training facility for volunteer search and rescue crews.

Seafarer's International Research Centre (SIRC)

\$284,175

SIRC was established in 1995 with a view to conducting research on seafarers. The Centre has a particular emphasis on issues of occupational health and safety. It is the only international research facility of its kind and has built up unparalleled experience of research in this field.

Vancouver Maritime Museum

\$9,515.50

The Vancouver Maritime Museum is located within Vanier Park on the Vancouver waterfront. The museum houses many exhibits, maritime art collections, and a library and archives. The main exhibit is the St. Roch, a historic arctic exploration vessel used by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. This grant funded the purchase of a large format printer for exhibits.

Warsash Maritime Academy, Southampton Solent University

\$1,500,000

The Southampton Marine and Maritime Institute (SMMI), is leading a consortium of universities and industry associations exploring the requirements for fatigue risk mitigation on board vessels, through studies of the longer-term psycho-social issues affecting the fatigue of whole teams at sea, and the cultural differences in the interpretation of the legislative framework. Participating organizations currently include the Stress Research Institute, Sweden, Southampton Solent University, UK, Center of Maritime Health and Society, Denmark, Dalian Maritime University, China and InterManager, Cyprus. Funding from the TK Foundation will provide support for the consortium.

International Seafarers Welfare and Assistance Network (ISWAN)

\$522,925.34

ISWAN is the result of a merger between the International Committee on Seafarers' Welfare (ICSW) and the International Seafarers Assistance Network (ISAN). ISWAN provides direct welfare services to seafarers through a 24-hour multilingual helpline, free for seafarers every day of the year to call from anywhere in the world. ISWAN also runs an emergency welfare fund for seafarers in dire need, produces health information for seafarers, and provides information on the location of seafarer centers. This grant will support a more robust emergency fund and help build an endowment.

Youth Development Sailing RFP

Center for Wooden Boats

\$10,000

The Center for Wooden Boats (CWB) provides on-the-water sailing experiences in downtown Seattle to at-risk youth. CWB partners with youth service organizations by providing the boats, waterfront gear and trained staff; the organizations bring youth to the programs and provide the intake and case management services. TK Foundation funding will enable CWB to expand services of the Youth Development through Sailing and Service Program.

El Viento Foundation

\$10,000

El Viento Foundation is a service organization based in Huntington Beach, California that uses sailing as a learning tool to connect with at-risk youth. El Viento offers mentoring, tutoring and educational planning starting in the 4th grade, through high school. A TK Foundation grant will

support their summer sailing program that is conducted in partnership with the Newport Seabase program.

Eleuthera Sailing and Swimming School

\$30,000

Eleuthera Sailing and Swimming School teaches Eleutheran youth sailing, swimming and sportsmanship. Funding will allow the Board to seek funding for a facility that would generate income making the organization self-sustaining. TK Foundation will provide up to \$30,000 over a three-year period. Funding for year two and three is contingent upon successful completion of objectives set forth in the presented proposal.

Grand Bahama Sailing Club

\$10,000

Grand Bahama Sailing Club promotes sailing throughout the youth of the island, ensuring sailing is available to every child who wishes to sail who would otherwise not have access. Programs offered range from sailing camps and after school sailing clubs to competitive team practices. The TK Foundation grant will help support the Community Sailing Sponsorship Program.

New College of Florida

\$9,285

New College of Florida provides the facility access and boat usage for the nonprofit, SailFuture. SailFuture is a nonprofit organization that utilizes sailing as a tool to make a difference in the lives of at-risk youth in the Sarasota-Brandenton area. The partnership with the college enables SailFuture to engage the youth in a college setting offering academic support and life skills workshops to build character and confidence.

Ocean Institute

\$30,000

The Ocean Institute teaches hands-on marine science, environmental education and maritime history programs. They take students out to explore live specimens, sea creatures, and deep-sea fish, observe migrating whales and collect scientific data. To teach maritime history and literature, students spend an entire night aboard the brig Pilgrim, where each student hauls lines, hoists sails, stands night watch and swabs the decks. Incorporated to the lessons are ocean appreciation and ocean pollution awareness. TK Foundation funding will support the Adopt-A-Class Tall Ship Sail Program over a three-year period.

Waa'gey

\$5,000

WAA'GEY is a community based driven nonprofit organization whose mission is *to assist various communities throughout the Yap outer islands and the main island Yap with arrays of social, environment and economic issues*. They identify and integrate with existing systems, issues of concerns, including environmental, educational, cultural and medical to suggest appropriate ways of addressing these issues and inspire community involvement and continuity. TK Foundation funding will support the Yap Youth Sailing into the Future Program through a Challenge Grant opportunity. Waa'gey is to show evidence of matching funds in the amount of \$5,000 specific to this proposal.

Young Mariners Foundation

\$10,000

Young Mariners Foundation is a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) after school and summer camp program. By using the universal principles of sailing, the program increases academic and life skills achievement for at-risk and underserved youth based. Funding

from The TK Foundation will support the Young Mariners After School Enrichment Program and Blue Water Bound Summer Camp.

Maritime Conference Support

Informa Maritime Events Colchester

\$2,505

This grant is to support the attendance of Harklina Fusheka at the 2013 LNG Shipping Conference.

Informa Maritime Events Colchester

\$3,630

Funding provided cadet transportation to the Asia Manning & Training Maritime Conference.

MPHRP

\$19,800

This grant provided travel/subsistence for 29 cadets to attend to attend the ASEAN Conference in Manila.

Sailor's Society Port Chaplains

\$2,184

This grant is to sponsor one delegate at the Sailors' Society's Global Chaplaincy Conference.

The Seamens' Church of New York and New Jersey

\$1,080

Funding will support Johnathan Thayer, archivist and PhD Candidate at the Graduate Center of the City University of New York, who will be research at the Health and Wellness of Seafarers Conference at the Maritime Historical Studies Centre, University of Hull from January 30 - February 1, 2014.

Warsash Maritime Academy, Southampton Solent University

\$1,450

This grant supported five conference attendees for the 21st Century Shipping-How Will the Industry Evolve Conference.

Webb Institute

\$6,728

This grant is to support Webb Institute students in attending the Offshore Technology Maritime Conference in Houston, TX in May 2013.

Webb Institute

\$9,927.30

This grant supported five students to attend the SNAME Conference in Seattle, WA.

Scholarship Establishment

Simon's Town School

\$15,000

This grant will support (a) maritime student(s), as directed by the staff of Lawhill Maritime Centre.

Maritime Scholarships

\$90,000

Maritime Fellowships-World Maritime University, Malmo, Sweden

\$205,483.20

Disaster Relief

Typhoon Haiyan affected over 10 million people in 6 islands. Housing and livelihoods in the worst affected areas was for the most part was gone. The TK Foundation granted \$150,000 to various nonprofits in the Philippines providing typhoon relief in the areas of food and medical supply distribution.

Action Against Hunger

\$15,000

Working in the Philippines since 2000, they are able to use their on-the-ground staff to provide distributions of drinking water and survival kits containing buckets, soap, and chlorine tablets. Mobile water treatment plants, massive “bladders” for clean water distribution, and emergency pumps and filtration systems are being set up to ensure access to water in the coming weeks. Action Against Hunger has a 10% administration cost and has received high ratings for their organizational and financial health from seven different third party charity evaluators.

AmeriCares

\$15,000

Working with local partners, they have deployed an emergency response team to help coordinate aid deliveries and assess survivors’ needs as well as provide antibiotics, wound care supplies and pain relievers. Additional funding will be provided to their partners for the purchase and distribution of relief supplies in the hardest-hit areas. AmeriCares runs a very lean program with only a 2% administration cost. Since 1982, they have provided \$10 billion in humanitarian aid to 147 countries.

CARE

\$25,000

Providing services in the Philippines since 1949, the first initial response is to provide food and shelter supplies to 10,000 to 15,000 families. CARE will then be focusing their efforts to rebuild the livelihood of those who lost everything in a manner that is sustainable. TK Foundation has donated to this organization in the past and has had a positive relationship.

Heifer International

\$10,000

Working with local organizations and the government to provide relief to 4,000 project members, they will help their farmers get back on track by providing food, water and building materials for shelter. They have committed to stay in the Philippines long after disaster relief teams leave to ensure the families are able to continue with sustainable farming and living. Heifer International's mission is to end hunger and poverty using gifts of livestock, seeds, trees and training in sustainable agriculture community development projects to help millions of people become self-reliant. Since 1944, Heifer has helped transform the lives of more than 18.5 million families (94.5 million people).

International Seafarers Welfare and Assistance Network (ISWAN) \$30,000

ISWAN is the result of a merger between the International Committee on Seafarers' Welfare (ICSW) and the International Seafarers Assistance Network (ISAN). ISWAN provides direct welfare services to seafarers through a 24-hour multilingual helpline, free for seafarers every day of the year to call from anywhere in the world. ISWAN also runs an emergency welfare fund for seafarers in dire need, produces health information for seafarers, and provides information on the location of seafarer centers. Funding will provide support a sub-fund of the Seafarers Emergency

Fund, specifically to assist seafarers and their families who have been affected by Typhoon Haiyan.

Philippines Red Cross (PRC)

\$40,000

Coordinating efforts with the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), who has an office and staff on the ground in Tacloban city, they have launched an appeal for 15 million Swiss francs (more than 16 million US dollars) to bring aid to 36,000 households for three months. TK Foundation has had a positive working relationship with the Red Cross in the past.

Salvation Army

\$15,000

The Salvation Army has a strong network throughout the Philippines and has been a trusted partner of the Manila Propeller Club. TKF Prop Club scholars have been working with the Salvation Army to make food/supply packages for typhoon-affected areas.

World Food Program USA

\$30,000

Already working in the Philippines, they are providing what is needed immediately; the basic needs of water, food and shelter. Logistic and telecommunications support is also being provided to the overall relief operation. With a 5% administrative fee, World Food Program USA is considered the world's largest humanitarian agency fighting hunger worldwide. More than 97 million people in 80 countries were provided with food assistance last year.

World Renew (Christian Reformed World Relief Committee)

\$10,000

Coordinating with 19 members of the Integral Alliance, they will be providing emergency food assistance, water, temporary shelter, and hygiene kits to those most in need. Contributions will be matched 1:1 by the Canadian government through December 8. Established in 1962 as a disaster response, relief, and adoption agency, they expanded their focus in 1979 to include international community development programs and eventually merged a third focus, justice education. Today, they are a well-established, bi-nationally-based organization with the reputation for innovative and sustainable grass-roots development and relief work around the world.

Miscellaneous Grants

National Veterans Transition Services, Inc.

\$25,000

The Reboot program helps veterans make the transition back to civilian life and civilian work environments after serving in the field. Reboot also addresses the psychological factors of transitioning from military to civilian life before release or immediately after. TK Foundation funding will support training sessions in Orange County, CA.
